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VALIDATION STATEMENT

When the National Archives acquired custody of this file, the accessioning procedures called for a manual comparison of the documentation to a printout of a portion of the records in each data set. This manual comparison is referred to as a "preliminary assessment" or "validation." The number of records which were compared varied from data set to data set. However, as a general rule the comparison involved less than ten records and was limited to only the first and last records in each data set. This is a statement of the results of the preliminary assessment or validation.

TYPE OF FILE:

Microdata; unit of observation is individuals within housing units.

UNIVERSE DESCRIPTION:

The universe consists of all persons in the civilian noninstitutional population of the United States living in households. The probability sample selected to represent the universe consists of approximately 77,000 households.

SUBJECT-MATTER DESCRIPTION:

Data are provided on labor force activity for the week prior to the survey. Comprehensive data are available on the employment status, occupation, and industry of persons 14 years old and over. Also shown are personal characteristics such as age, sex, race, marital status, veteran status, household relationship, educational background, and Spanish origin.

The June 1980 supplement consists of three major parts: marital history, fertility history, and birth expectations. In addition, questions about support of children living elsewhere were asked of men in their second or later marriage or who were currently widowed, separated, or divorced.

Items on marital history provide data for as many as three marriages, the first two and the most recent. Questions were asked of all civilian household members 15 to 75 years of age who had ever been married. These questions included date of marriage, date marriage ended in widowhood or divorce, and for marriages ending in divorce, the date of separation of households.

Questions on fertility history were asked of all women 18 to 75 years of age and women 15 to 18 years old who had ever been married. Data are provided on the number of liveborn children and date of birth, sex, and current residence of as many as five of the children, the first four and the last.

Figures on birth expectations present an assessment of the number of children women between the ages of 18 and 39 expect to have during their remaining childbearing years.

GEOGRAPHIC COVERAGE:

All States and 44 SMSA's are identified and ranked by population size (1970). Central city/noncentral city indicators are provided for records in all identified SMSA's and for all other records except where suppression is required for confidentiality reasons.

ATTACHMENT 2

Current Population Survey Non-March Record Layouts

Attached are record layouts for the June 1980 Current Population Survey. Record layouts illustrating basic data collected each month comprise Attachment 3 for interviewed households, Attachment 4 for noninterviewed Type A households, and Attachment 5 for noninterviewed Type B or C households. (See items 14 and 15 on questionnaire for examples of each type.) Next follows the record layouts for children and supplemental data collected.

In the record layout, location of data is indicated by character position within a word. Each word signifies six character positions on the tape. To determine the location of specific data, calculate the number of positions allocated for all previous words; then, to that figure, add the character location (1-6) specified within the designated word. For example, data for major activity last week (Attachment 3, page 12) corresponds to word 9, character 1.. Multiplying the number of previous words by the number of character positions per word equals 48 positions allocated for data. Thus, the first character of word 9 is located in position 49.

To determine the location of data reflecting the reason a respondent works less than 35 hours a week (word 9, characters 5-6), repeat the above calculations except substitute a "5" (noting character position within word) in place of the "1". Calculations show that this item occupies character positions 53 and 54.

Record layouts are similar for both interviewed and noninterviewed households. Geographic data are provided for both types of records, but employment figures are furnished only for interviewed households. For noninterviewed households, these corresponding character positions are blank or padded. However, in character positions 37 and 38, interview records show data for item 20, whether the household member worked last week, and range of hours worked; noninterview Type A records show race of head and reason for noninterview; noninterview Types B and C records show reason for noninterview.



ATTACHMENT 7

Types of Data Items on the June 1980 Current Population
Survey Marital and Fertility History Supplement

Three types of data are contained for items relating to questions 28A through 43 on the supplementary page to the June 1980 Current Population Survey. "Pre-edited" items (prefixed by a "C" in the record layout) contain essentially the original marital event dates as read by the FOSDIC reader from the supplemental pages of the CPS-1 schedule. They include items 30, 32, 33, 34, 37, 38, 40, 42, and 43. "Unedited" items for the preceding questions (prefixed by a "U" in the record layout) are to be interpreted as working variables in the program after a preliminary husband-wife consistency check has been made for the reporting of marital dates. "Edited" items (prefixed by an "E" in the record layout) indicate the final values for items after consistency checks and allocations for missing data have been made.

For all other variables in the supplemental record layout not mentioned in the preceding section, only unedited and edited values are provided. The unedited items for all of the remaining variables are the original data items as read by the FOSDIC reader. The edited items, as stated previously, are the final values for the variables after consistency checks and allocations for missing data have been made.
