The Current Population Survey has as its main objective the gathering of data on labor force activity for the week prior to the survey. Comprehensive data are avialable on the employment status, occupation, and industry of persons 14 years old age and over, in addition to demographic information about these persons.

The October 1981 Current Population Survey also gathered supplemental data on school enrollment for all persons three years old and over: whether attending public or private school, grade, if in school when over 14, year of high school graduation of those from 14 to 34 or last year of school for non-graduates. College students indicated whether enrolled in a 2 or 4-year program, as well as the degree anticipated. Those working towards associates degrees specified if the program was occupational or general. College-age persons indicated whether they were taking any business, vocational, technical or correspondence courses other than job training.

The civilian non-institutionalized population of the United States was sampled and approximately 77,000 households were surveyed. The October 1981 Current Population Survey data are contained in a rectangular file of 170,567 records, each with a logical record length of 600 characters. Class IV

ABSTRACT

Current Population Survey, October 1981 [machine-readable data file] / conducted by the Bureau of the Census for the Bureau of Labor Statistics. --Washington: Bureau of the Census [producer and distributor], 1982.

TYPE OF FILE:

Microdata; unit of observation is individuals within housing units.

UNIVERSE DESCRIPTION:

The universe consists of all persons in the civilian noninstitutional population of the United States living in households. The probability sample selected to represent the universe consists of approximately 77,000 households.

SUBJECT-MATTER DESCRIPTION:

Data are provided on labor force activity for the week prior to the survey. Comprehensive data are available on the employment status, occupation, and industry of persons 14 years old and over. Also shown are personal characteristics such as age, sex, race, marital status, veteran status, household relationship, educational background, and Spanish origin.

The file also contains school enrollment data for all persons three years old and over. Data include whether attending public or private school, grade attending, if enrolled in school in October 1980 for respondents 14 years and over, year of high school graduation for respondents between the ages of 14 and 34, or the last year attending regular school for nongraduates between the ages of 14 and 24. Data for college students include whether attending full or part-time at a 2- or 4-year college and the type of degree currently working toward. Persons working toward an associate degree were asked to specify if this degree was in an occupational program or a general arts and sciences program. Responses from college students and persons not enrolled in school indicated whether they were taking any business, vocational, technical, or correspondence courses other than on the job training.

GEOGRAPHIC COVERAGE:

All States and 44 SMSA's are identified and ranked by population size (1970). Central city/noncentral city indicators are provided for records in all identified SMSA's. For all other records, central city/noncentral city

and nonSMSA indicators are provided except where suppression is required for confidentiality reasons.

TECHNICAL DESCRIPTION:

FILE STRUCTURE: Rectangular.

FILE SIZE: 170,567 logical records; 600 character logical record length.

FILE SORT SEQUENCE: State rank by SMSA rank by household identification number by line number.

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ATTACHMENT 2

CURRENT POPULATION SURVEY NON-MARCH RECORD LAYOUTS

Attached are record layouts for the October 1981 Current Population Survey. Record layouts illustrating basic data collected each month comprise Attachment 3 for interviewed households, Attachment 4 for noninterviewed Type A households, and Attachment 5 for noninterviewed Type B or C households. (See items 14 and 15 on questionnaire for examples of each type.) Next follows the record layouts for children and supplemental data collected.

In the record layout, location of data is indicated by character position within a word. Each word signifies six character positions on the tape. To determine the location of specific data, calculate the number of positions allocated for all previous words; then, to that figure, add the character location (1-6) Specified within the designated word. For example, data for major activity last week (Attachment 3, page 12) corresponds to word 9, character 1. Multiplying the number of previous words by the number of character positions per word equals 48 positions allocated for data. Thus, the first character of word 9 is located in position 49.

To determine the location of data reflecting the reason a respondent works less than 35 hours a week (word 9, characters 5-6), repeat the above calculations except substitute a "5" (noting character position within word) in place of the "1". Calculations show that this item occupies character positions 53 and 54.

Record layouts are similar for both interviewed and noninterviewed households. Geographic data are provided for both types of records, but employment figures are furnished only for interviewed households. For noninterviewed households, these corresponding character positions are blank or padded. However, in character positions 43 and 44, interview records show data for item 20, whether the household member worked last week, and range of hours worked; noninterview Type A records show race of head and reason for noninterview; noninterview Types B and C records show reason for noninterview.
